

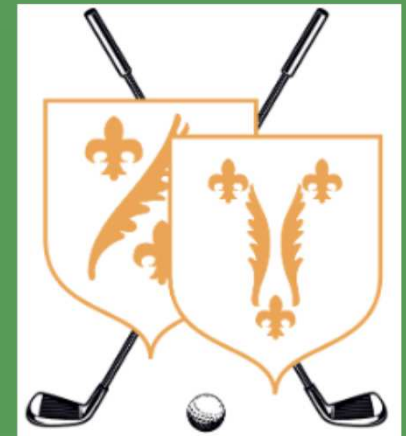

 - Baron Ramsay (Finnish connection – see later)
 - Mr Hilles
 - Lord Wester Weymiss
 - Lord Derby
 - ...

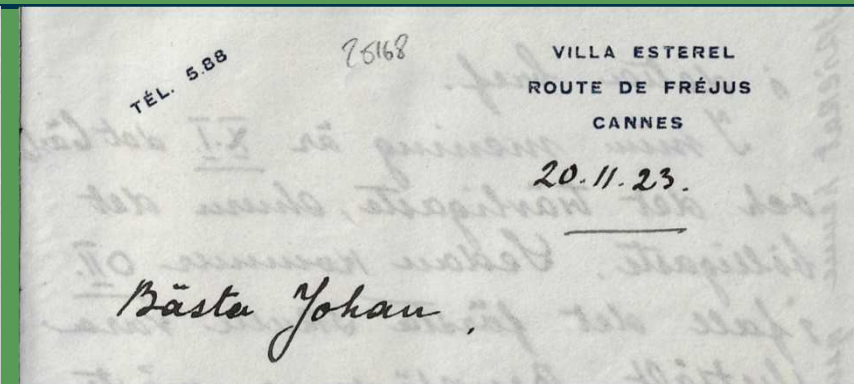

FINLAND TAKES UP GOLF

Helsingfors, Wednesday.

Stanley Turner, the English professional, formerly of Frilford Heath, Oxford, has been appointed professional to Finland's first golf club which was opened recently at Tali Gard.

It is a nine holes course about seven kilometres from Helsingfors, and is situated on a magnificent estate, the manor house of which has been converted into an up-to-date clubhouse.

- Initially limited to 100 (then 150) members
- Most were British members
 - J.K.N.V. (col.) Burburry (Hon. Sec) :
“God forbid I should ever be secretary of a French club.”
 - 1924 an under-secretary (called *French Sec.*) was appointed

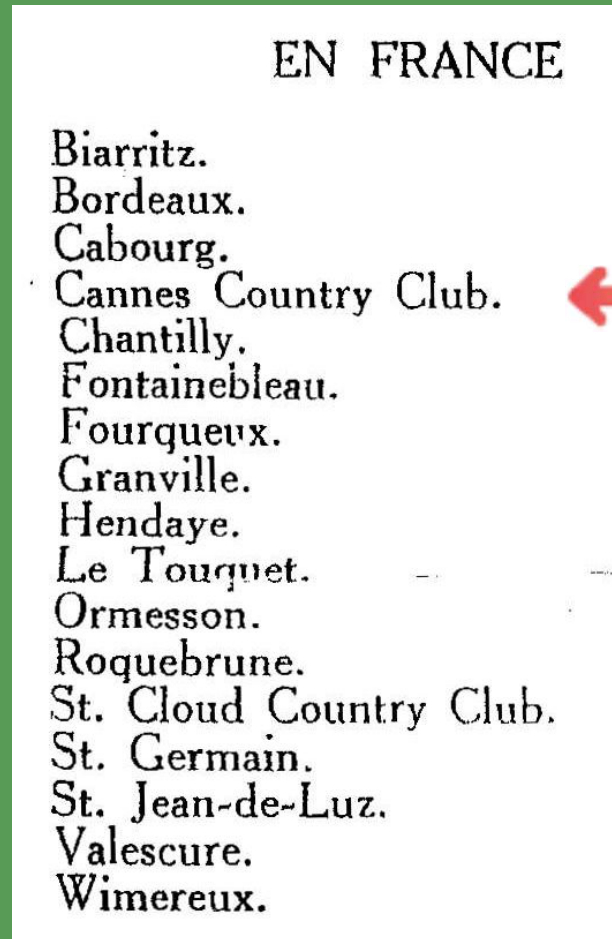
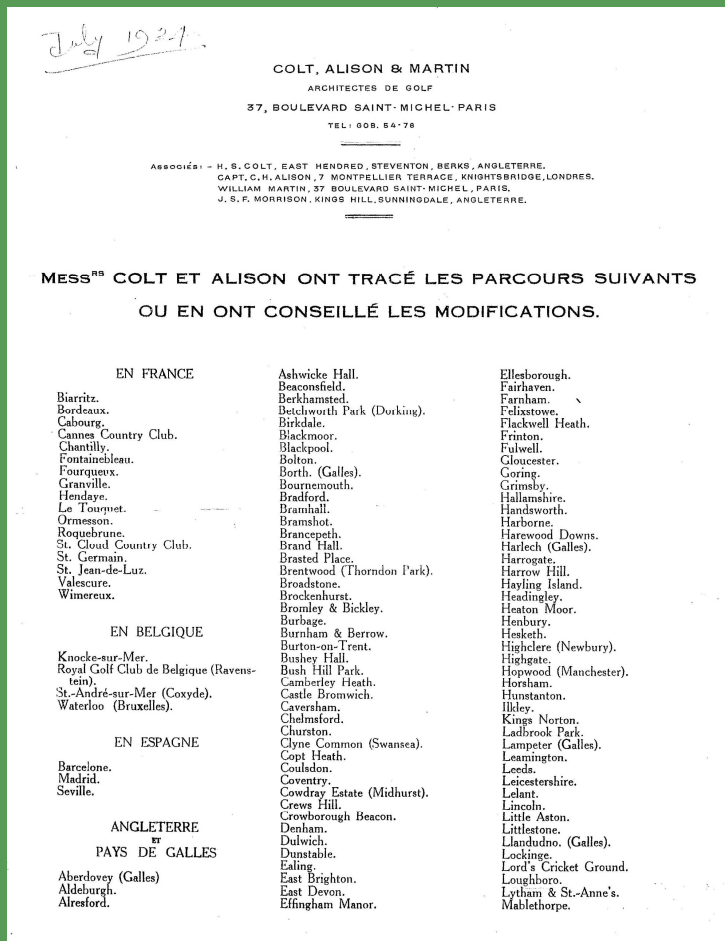

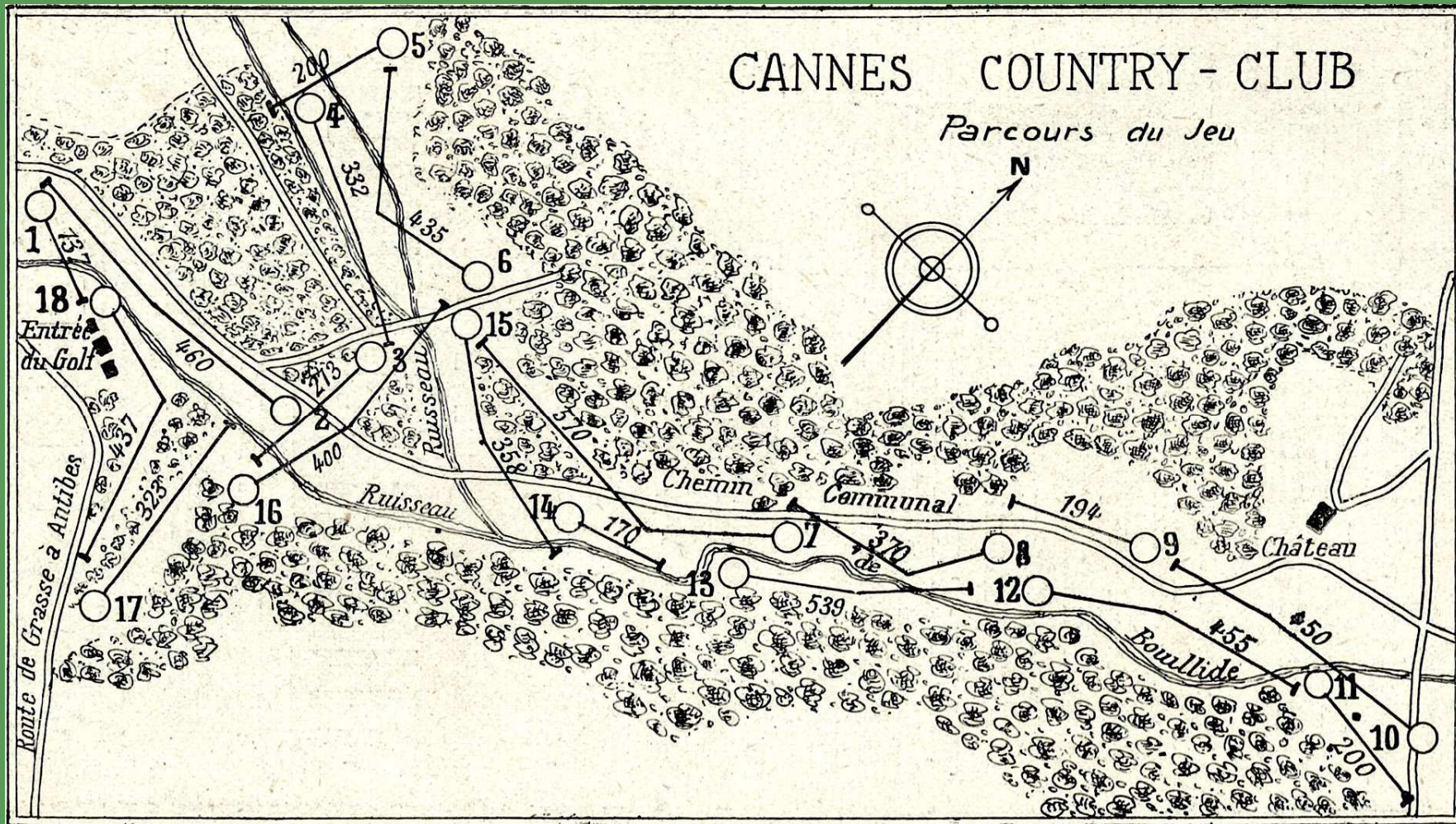
- Designed by H. S. Colt

Cannes Mougins – Nowadays

Cannes-Mougins after WWII

15

- 1945 – 1975 : thirty hard years
 - In 1948 : A significant shortfall
 - Help of the municipality of Cannes (four years)
 - After the 1950, the club began to live again ... or rather to survive



Cannes-Mougins – rebirth 1975

16

- In the early 1970s, a few friends dreamed of a Mougins as it was before the war:
 - Henri Lemoine et Jacques Banwarth, leading the group
 - Guy Lemaire, Jacques Rideau, Francis Vagliano ...
- In November 1978 the club was fully renewed
 - Peter Allis & Dave Thomas re-designed the course (respecting the original layout Colt's work)
